

What is the Teen Advisory Board (TAB)? TAB is a group of library teen volunteers who not only help the library and community, but take an active leadership role in implementing programs, promoting, and advocating for youth services at the South Regional Library.

How do I join TAB?

- Must be in grades 6 – 12
- Attend the monthly meetings at South Regional Library (currently on a Saturday morning at 11am).
- Register for TAB meetings at the library's website.

How do I stay on TAB?

- Attend as many of the official monthly meetings as possible.
- School year commitment (September – May). The monthly time commitment is approximately 4 hours per month.
- Participation at meetings and committee work
- Excellent communication skills and highly dedicated
- It's okay if you go on vacation or are less involved one month than the other. Missing here and there is fine, but not for a lengthy period.

What are some TAB specific projects?

- Advises staff and pilots programs and services for teens
- Assist with South Regional's new MakerSpace
- Create book displays and reading lists
- Provide book reviews

What do I gain from being on TAB?

- Insight and experience in complex planning and organization
- Explore creative, practical, and innovative applications of various ideas
- Balance working in teams and individually
- Practice creative problem solving
